In order for us to be able to accept your patient for antenatal care, referring GPs/medical specialists are required to provide:

If requesting an urgent review please include relevant detail and results. Acknowledgment of referral receipt will occur within <b>eight</b> working days. ### **REFERRAL PRIORITY: MATERNITY SERVICE – TRANSITIONS ALCOHOL AND DRUG CLINIC**

The clinical information provided in your referral will determine the triage category. The triage category will affect the timeframe in which the patient is offered an appointment.

Referral priority	Appointment timeframe	
Urgent	Within 30 days depending on clinical need	
Routine	Longer than 30 days depending on clinical need	

#### **OTHER INFORMATION: TRANSITIONS ALCOHOL AND DRUG CLINIC**

## The Transitions Alcohol and Drug Clinic provides specialist multidisciplinary care for pregnant women with substance use issues. If making a referral please note the following:

- We provide obstetric and paediatric care to pregnant women who currently or recently had issues with cannabis, heroin, ice, alcohol, prescription medications or other substances.
- We are staffed by obstetricians (including a methadone prescriber) midwives, social workers, a paediatrician, a dietitian, a psychologist and a psychiatrist.
- Midwives provide one-on-one antenatal education with a specific focus on substance use.
- Women on methadone and buprenorphine programs or needing to be stabilised on methadone are also appropriate referrals.
- A drug and alcohol assessment is taken at the first visit and appropriate counselling and referrals organised.
- It is important that you take an accurate and up-to-date drug history (drug type, amount, frequency, etc.) to enable risk assessment and timely booking of appropriate appointments.
- Missing information will result in delays in processing your patient's referral, so please include all relevant clinical information to avoid this occurring.
- Although many patients would not be suitable for the Shared Care Program, the staff work closely with GPs and are flexible regarding
  individualised arrangements where appropriate.
