# Following your outpatient endosurgery procedure

This leaflet gives helpful tips for patients following a hysteroscopy or insertion of Mirena© (IUD).

## General well-being

- You can eat and drink normally after your procedure.
- You can return to normal activities after your test.

## What to expect

- Mild cramping pain that is similar to period pain. This should settle down in a few days.
- If in pain, try a heat pack. You can take pain relief such as paracetamol.
- Vaginal bleeding may last up to a week. This bleeding may stop and start. This is normal.

## **Hygiene habits**

- You can have a shower normally.
- Avoid baths, spas and swimming pools. There is a small risk of infection.

#### Sexual intercourse

• Avoid sex for seven days. This can help prevent an infection.

## When can I use tampons again?

• Do not use tampons during your next period. This will help to prevent an infection. After your next period, you can start to use tampons again.

## Will I have a follow-up appointment?

 You might need a follow-up appointment in the outpatient gynaecology clinic. Your doctor will inform you of this after your procedure.

## Points to remember

Contact your general practitioner (GP) or your gynaecologist if you notice:

- persistent bleeding from the vagina that becomes heavier than a normal period and is bright red.
- severe lower abdominal pain that is not relieved by pain medication.
- a fever.
- an offensive smelling vaginal discharge.
- increasing nausea and vomiting.
- pain or burning on passing urine. Or the need to pass urine often.
  - o This may indicate a urinary tract infection.

If you think it is an emergency and are unable to see your GP, please go straight to the Emergency Department of your nearest hospital.
